We will continue to take great pride in keeping an organized and clean greenhouse. Our meticulous love and care will still be seen in the quality of our plants. ****** IMPATIENS WARNING ****** **DOWNY MILDEW: LEARNING TO LIVE WITH IT.**

Impatiens, that dependable go-to flower for shady areas, is still under attack by a disease called Impatiens Downy Mildew (IDM). Concerns arose for the most popular bedding plant annual as over a two year period parts of Europe and South Africa reported almost a total loss of impatiens. A couple of years ago by the end of the season, downy mildew had arrived wide spread locally. Most commercial landscapers have already moved on and will not plant impatiens walleriana, due to the risk of infection.

It's impossible to predict what will happen with IDM in 2017, since there are many factors involved in where it appears and why. Weather plays a huge role. Researchers do know IDM can spread through soil, water and air. There are no real or cost effective treatments in landscapes for treating infected plants. Plants that are infected will start by yellowing and show tell-tale white spores on the undersides of their leaves. Downy mildew spores can persist in an infected area for several years even without a plant host.

In response to this pressuring disease, we have greatly reduced our growing of seed impatiens. We suggest to all of our customers to consider suitable substitutes for impatiens while breeders attempt to pursue more resistant types. Bounce impatiens, New Guinea impatiens and Sunpatiens are believed to be resistant to downy mildew. Other shade plants to consider are begonias, coleus, lobelia, nicotiana, salvia, torenia, and vinca. We want you to be a successful and satisfied gardener. We also know some "diehards" will plant what they always have. For those people, we have impatiens, which are "free" of disease at this time and can only say "good luck".
